### The NATO Waveform Policy

- Defines NATO approach to the introduction, management, and dissemination of NATO waveform specifications and reference software
- Advisory to NATO Nations and mandatory for NATO staff and organizations
- Does not mandate changes to existing NATO standard already implemented by Nations
- Approved by the North Atlantic Council, NATO's highest political committee [C-M(2015)0041]
- Transmitted in May 2018 to WInnF for consideration by SDS Committee





## Waveform Policy Major Points

- Waveform standards shall be free of charge to NATO and NATO
  Nations and be freely redistributable within them
- Specifications shall be supported by reference software in due course to facilitate development and interoperability testing for target software
- Base waveform software may be used as a basis for development, as long as it is unbiased and has fair IPR
- Target software need not be free of charge or IPR
- Software should be based on open software standards when possible, using SCA and associated SDR standards to facilitate sharing
- Goal to develop **NATO repository** of specifications and software





### Waveform Repository

- Goal to provide properly controlled access for all stakeholders to waveform artifacts
- No repository has been created yet; however,
  NATO CI Agency is developing options





#### Issues for Consideration

- Some identified issues:
  - What are the normal conditions for **redistribution** of artifacts?
  - What are the normal conditions for reuse of artifacts?
  - What are the recommended artifacts for the registry?
  - How will the C3 Board enter into agreements? C3 Board decisions are made by committee consensus, not by officials who can sign documents
- NATO and WInnF dialogue can help refine and resolve open questions





### Relationships with WInnF

- The Policy recognizes that both NATO and non-NATO Nations, including multinational programs and industry, will drive development of SCA and associated SDR standards
- NATO sees value in participating in WINNF SDS Committee activities through appointment of Advisors from NATO
- NATO C3 Board wishes to strengthen collaboration with industry to maintain a competitive advantage for the Alliance, and would consider additional ways to liaise with WINNF
- NATO welcomes feedback regarding the Policy and its implementation from WInnF
